INTRODUCTION

CAPAA partnered with KAYA strategik, LLC - a WMBE providing equitable strategy, implementation and engagement services to conduct data research and analysis on the latest (ACS 2019) Asian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander demographic trends in Washington State.








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WASHINGTON STATE POPULATION BY RACE (2019)















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

















A. Summary Analysis of ANHPI Community Demography

As of 2019, the ANHPI (alone or in combination) community comprises approximately 12.3% of the total WA state population with NHPI's at 1.3% and Asians at 11%. Most ANHPI women and men fall within the 35-64 age category.

Vietnamese, Korean, Khmer-Cambodian and Chinese communities have higher rates of limited English proficiency while South Asian Indian communities including those that speak Hindi, Urdu and Gujurati tend towards having higher rates of speaking English "very well".

Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders have the lowest pay averages and education outcomes (least to have Bachelors degree or higher at 12.9%), particularly in comparison to Asians and Whites.

The majority of NHPI populations are located in King (16,944), Pierce (12,848), Snohomish (4,197), Clark (3,751) and Spokane (2,799) counties. The significant opportunities for NHPI voter education, registration and citizenship opportunities are similarly in these counties in addition to Thurston, Whatcom and Kitsap counties.


The majority of Asian populations are located in King (386,404), Snohomish (86,121), Pierce (55,571), Clark (21,752) and Thurston (15,832) counties. The significant opportunities for Asian voter education, registration and citizenship opportunities are similarly in these counties in addition to Kitsap, Whatcom, Spokane and Whitman counties.

PART V: SUMMARY ANALYSIS


i. How much has the WA ANHPI population grown since 2010?

In Washington, the **ANHPI alone or in combination community has grown by about 34.3%** from 674,573 in 2010 to 905,774 in 2019. The Asian alone or in combination community grew from 604,251 in 2010 to 812,035 in 2019 at an **increase of about 34.4%**. The NHPI alone or in combination community grew from 70,322 in 2010 to 93,739 in 2019 at an **increase of about 33.3%**

PART V: SUMMARY ANALYSIS

ii: Are ANHPI's the largest or second largest minority population in WA?


The ANHPI alone and in combination population is the **2nd largest minority population** at 905,774 after the Hispanic/Latino population at 937,579.

iii. Are ANHPI's the fastest-growing minority population in WA?

ANHPI's were the fastest growing minority population at a growth rate of 34.3% compared to that of the Hispanic/Latino population at a growth rate of 24.1% from 2010 to 2019.

iv. What is the fastest growing ANHPI ethnicity in WA?

The fastest growing ANHPI ethnicities are Asian Indian, Chinese and other Asian categories (for example, Burmese and Bhutanese communities). Of note, other Pacific Islanders also grew significantly, specifically Compact of Free Association Migrants (COFA Communities) from the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands and the Republic of Palau.

v. Where are our communities growing the most in Washington State?

ANHPI communities growing quickly in WA are in King, Snohomish, Pierce, Thurston, Spokane, Clark and Whitman counties respectively.

vi. What are the top spoken ANHPI languages in WA?

The top ANHPI languages spoken are Chinese (89,549), Vietnamese (61,610), Tagalog (56,497), Korean (48,425) and other Pacific Islander languages (29.876).

vii. What's the pay gap of ANHPI's as compared to whites in WA? What's the pay gap between subgroups in WA?

Native Hawaiian Pacific Islanders, Filipinos, Vietnamese and Koreans earn less than whites per capita income.* Asian women earn about \$.75 to the dollar (or 25% less) than Asian males. Similarly, NHPI women earn .\$75 to the dollar (or 25% less) than NHPI males.

*Note that considering the average pay factors individuals with very large incomes, which may skew and lean towards a higher average income; potentially veiling lower income data.

viii. ANHPI poverty and student discrepancy compared to whites in WA.

NHPIs and Asians have a higher poverty rate at 15.3% and 9.3%, respectively, in comparison with whites at 8.1%. Both the Asians and especially NHPI have higher rates of free student lunch eligibility than the overall population, especially in counties with significant ANHPI populations. While a high rate of Asians tend to have a college education compared to whites, NHPI communities have lesser rates of attending college.
